

SUDAN NORTH

From the „Mother of the sharks“ to the research village of Jacques Cousteau!



Sudan is one of the largest countries in Africa and extends over 400 km along the Red Sea. As in Egypt also in Sudan the landscape, except on the bank of the Nile and some oases, is barren and desolate. As the country has no touristic infrastructure, a liveaboard is the only way to explore the stunning, pristine underwater world, as Hans Hass and Jacques Cousteau did also decades ago.

Between Angarosh, the mother of sharks, Shaab Rumi, the reef of Jacques Cousteau and the Wingate Reef on which Umbria is located, you'll find a stunning, pristine underwater world.

Not without reason Jacques Cousteau has built his Precontinent II in Sudan. The underwater research village can still be dived and is a highlight on this tour. Although the buildings are impressive, but you should never forget to look into the blue water.

The reefs in Sudan are marked by jagged edges of reefs, caves and canyons and often nearly straight sloping drop offs, in Qita el Banna even more than 400 m. Often one meets current, in which swarms of hammerhead sharks, grey sharks, white and black tip reef sharks cavort.

But also mantas, sea turtles and huge schools of jacks, snappers and barracudas can be found. Not infrequently, a group of napoleon, batfish or fusiliers mixes under the reef community.

But the species diversity in coral is not to be underestimated. On the steep walls gorgonians are often standing in the current, lined with soft and hard corals in all colors. If you want to get only the best in front of the mask, what the Red Sea has offer, a liveaboard in the Sudan is essential.


The arrival is via Cairo to Port Sudan or via Dubai to Port Sudan. The Seawolf Safari team supports you in all matters.
